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50 years bringing potential to life at Rainbows



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Rainbows United, Inc. was founded in 1972 as a developmental training center for children with severe, multiple disabilities who were ineligible for special education services provided through the public schools. In the late 1970's, when legislation required public schools to provide services to all children of school age regardless of their disability, Rainbows began focusing on delivery of early intervention services to children below school age and wrap-around family support services to children birth through age 21.

Legislation in the early 1990's extended mandated special education services to children beginning at age three. Rainbows continues to serve children three to five with special needs through the Community Based Education/ Training Services (CBETS) and children birth to age three through Infant/Toddler Services, known as *tiny-k*, in Sedgwick County, and later in Butler County.

Since 1994, Rainbows has been the sponsoring agency for Connecting Point, a project of the Sedgwick County Early Childhood Coordinating Council which brings together more than 40 agencies committed to young children.

Today, Rainbows provides center based, community based and home based service options for children birth - 21 with special needs. Service components currently include hearing and vision specialty services, respite care for individuals across the life span, early intervention, high quality preschool classes, case management services, supported family living, foster care for children with special needs, therapies, mental health services, Autism waiver services, and specialized child care

Serving more than 4,234 children, birth - 21, with special needs or at risk and their families this year, Rainbows continues a deep rooted commitment to enhancing the lives of children with special needs for many years to come.



Rainbows United Timeline

1972 – Founded by Linda Weir Enegren in basement of a church, 5 volunteers to serve 5 children

1984 – 107 children served, Home-based services added

1992 – 325 children served, Ritchie Family Center in operation, Community Based Education and Training Services added

1993 – 619 children served, Targeted Case Management added

1996 – 1,127 children served, Kids' Cove opened

1997 – Camp Woodchuck provides summer fun for those 6-21

1997 – 1,152 children served, Infant/Toddler Services extended to Butler County

1998 – 1,156 children served, Uptown Kids and Family Enrichment Center opened

2002 – 1,601 children served, Structured classrooms for autism implemented

2003 – Rainbows United Charitable Foundation, Inc. established as separate 509(a)(3)

2005 – 1,819 children served, Fashion Passion's first year, Pre-K program

2007 – Rainbows celebrates 35th Birthday, 7,253 children served in 35 years

2009 – Kids' Point opened, Financial irregularities result in Chapter 11 Bankruptcy filing July 30

2010 – Rainbows restructured, downsized to three locations and continues to serve more than 3,400 children with special needs or at risk annually

2012 – Rainbows celebrates 40 years of service to children with special needs

2022 – Rainbows celebrates 50 years, 4,234 children served
